Andy Warhol Challenge

Andy Warhol was an artist who used the style 'pop art'.


Pop art was inspired by the world around us, including food packaging, famous people and music. Warhol took every day items such as soup cans and used these as the focus of his art. He created prints of 'Campbell's soup' in every flavour.

Could you design your own soup can? Which colours would you use? Would the colours be linked to the flavour?

Andy Warhol created pictures of famous people and used several different colours for each image, putting them together to make one image.

Could you have a go? You will need to take a picture of yourself and print it several times in black and white. Once you have done this, choose two colours per picture and colour it in.

Stick them side by side to see your Warhol inspired art.



Make a kaleidoscope

You will need - a toilet roll tube, coloured paper, mirrored card or foil, a straw (paper is best), scissors, tape and colouring pencils/pens.

Method -


Cover your toilet roll tube with coloured paper and secure with tape. Cut 3 pieces of mirrored card, these should be the length and width of the tube. Place these into the tube. mirror facing into the tube and should look like a triangle.


Draw around a mug or cup to make a circle, it needs to be bigger than the tube. Cut this out and decorate it. Then put a hole in the middle of the circle, thread the straw through and bend the end.

Put the circle over 1 end of the tube and the straw should be outside of the tube. Cut the straw so it is the same length as the tube then tape it to the tube.

What can you see?









Maths Puzzles
