Assessment and Pupil Conferencing

As you may know your child's academic progress is assessed across each term. Teachers make on going assessment, through their observations and marking, almost on a daily basis. They also use formal methods too such as tests and timed answers. This term we are developing things further through pupil conferencing.





This means giving each child a one to one slot with their teacher to talk about their work and progress individually. So far it has proved enormously useful and an excellent way of hearing detail about what your child has found straight forward or tricky. From that we can plan support or extension appropriately. Inevitably this is quite time consuming but we feel benefits will be there. Do talk to you child about this although bear in mind the roll out will be over several weeks.
