Our final activity was to try and pick up different items using a range of objects. ### Green group Mitsubishi trip



On Friday 6th June, Green Group went to Mitsubishi Electric where we learnt all about how to save and use energy. This included solar energy, wind energy and water energy. We got to do some fun experiments. We used a fan and a model wind turbine and we measured the wind speed and saw how the wind turbine moved and made electricity. We investigated how the angles of the blades changed how fast the wind turbines rotated. We also learned about heat pumps. We got a thermometer and measured the temperature of some ice. We put the ice in hot water and measured the temperature of the water. We found out that the ice started to melt and the temperature went up and the temperature of the water went down. We used heat lamps to shine their light on some mini solar panels. We attached the solar panels to a fan, light and a buzzer so there was electricity to make them work. ## **Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices**

A new National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence, including unauthorised holiday absence, has now been introduced following changes to the law.

## Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines. Parent refers to anyone with parental responsibility and may include carers, step-parents, grandparents or any other adult with parental responsibility.

## National Threshold

There is a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a

#### **First Offence**

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave of absence or unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days

### Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child within 28 days

#### Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court.

• Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines up to £2.500

• Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'

combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.
