Medication in school

We would like to remind all parents that we cannot administer short term medication in school. This includes prescribed antibiotics and Hayfever relief. If your child is prescribed a course of antibiotics, you are more than welcome to come into school to administer the required dose. We recommend avoiding the children's lunch break and coming to the office either just before 12pm or just after 1pm. This is to have the least disruption to the class and their learning.























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
Upcoming changes to term time holiday

From September, unauthorised absences of more than 10 sessions (5 school days) will be liable for fixed penalty notices. Fines will be increasing to £160 per parent for each child.

The other major change to be aware of is that from September, rules around repeated unauthorised absences will be introduced. Term time holidays will remain on file for three years and any subsequent unauthorised absences within the three-year period will attract increasingly harsh penalties as follows:

- For a first period of more than 5 days of unauthorised absence, a fine of £160 per parent, per child will be applied. This may be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- If a parent receives a second fine for the same child within a three-year period, this will be charged at the higher rate of £160 per parent per child, even if paid promptly.
- Fines per parent will be capped to 2 fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, a third holiday within three years may mean that you are prosecuted for failing to ensure that your child attends school regularly. Courts may impose a parenting order and/or a fine of up to £2,500. You could receive a criminal record which would show up on any future employment searches or DBS checks.
