<ol> <li>Stance – how to stand when hitting the ball</li> <li>Feet parallel to one another – no wider than shoulder width apart.</li> <li>Slightly back from the ball (15-30cm)</li> <li>Ball in between feet (middle to front of body)</li> <li>Head over the ball.</li> </ol>	Chipping Tick-tock – brush the ground with the back of the club to get the ball into the air .
