#### Cold weather

The cold weather has officially arrived, we want to remind all parents to ensure that your child is appropriately dressed for school and has a warm coat with them each day. ### School Meals

We have been notified by Herts Catering Ltd that the cost of school meals is increasing from next term. As of 1st April 2024, the price of a meal will be £3.40. This price rise is due to the rapidly increasing cost of food and labour being faced across the catering industry.

All children in Reception and Key Stage 1 will remain eligible to receive meals for free under the Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM) initiative.

### Year 5 Distractions

In January year five went into the gym to learn about how to be safe on the road. We talked about how you should not use your phone on the road. Mr Ming Lai talked about the four rules STOP. LOOK. LISTEN. THINK. When you are on your phone you can't stop, look, listen and think because you're focused on your phone. You are distracted by what is happening on the road because you are looking and listening to the sounds thinking about the phone. Next in the gym we did a special training activity where two children went around plungers and they could NOT touch them. They were timed without their phone and were quite quick. The next round they had to type something on their phone and try and not touch the plungers but they touched them a few times because they were distracted typing on their phone. We learnt the importance of STOP, LOOK, LISTEN, THINK.




### Ruby Finds a Worry by Tom Percival

### Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices

A reminder that Hertfordshire County Council issues Penalty Notices which meet the Hertfordshire Code of Conduct <u>regardless of the overall level of the pupil's attendance.</u> Please be advised that the Governing Body has agreed that Welwyn St Mary's will be following this guidance.

This means that unauthorised absence exceeding 15 sessions (each day is two sessions) over 2 consecutive terms risks a fine of up to £120 per parent for each individual child. The Local Education Authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, for failure to secure your child's regular attendance at school. One session is equal to a morning or an afternoon.

So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.



















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### Please note that:

- Even brief term time holidays can affect children in school adversely for some weeks, both before and after the actual vacation.
- Very few children can afford to miss aspects of the school curriculum.
- Staff are unable to provide activities for your child to complete during unauthorised absences from school.
- It is also highly unlikely that your child will be able to 'catch up' on the work undertaken by classmates whilst your child is on holiday.

We appreciate your understanding and thank you for supporting us in maintaining our high attendance record.
