- Miss Popham for her great teaching in our reception class. We wish you all the best for the future.





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

Walking home - Advise from PCSO

Following recent reports of incidents around Welwyn village please see below advise from PCO Anne Devine to make sure everyone gets home safely:

- Walk home with a friend, or a friend and their parents if the parent cannot get there.
- Keep vigilant when out and about, avoid going on phones and ensure to be taking in the surroundings.
- Don't take short cuts down alley ways. Stick to main road routes when possible.
- If anyone feels they are being followed or someone is speaking to them in manner that is not acceptable then they need to call this in via 101 or 999 if they feel threatened in any way when this is happening.
- If they have for some reason gone home first and then want to call this in then that's ok too but there will be less of a chance of catching them still in the area. Police will ask for descriptions like, height, hair colour, clothing, age, any distinguishing features etc. So, try to get the best description possible. A photo is even better.





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Labelling uniform

Please ensure that all items of clothing are labelled with your child's name. This includes coats and hats which are often taken off in the playground during break times and are very difficult to reunite with their owners if not labelled.


Tesco Community Grants

To complete the Summer Reading Challenge, a child reads six library books of their choice, returning to the library to share what they have been reading with staff and volunteers. Each participant receives a collector folder and is awarded stickers for every book they read. Children who complete the challenge are presented with a certificate, a medal and a special finishing gift.





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


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Book recommendation

Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices

A reminder that Hertfordshire County Council issues Penalty Notices which meet the Hertfordshire Code of Conduct regardless of the overall level of the pupil's attendance. Please be advised that the Governing Body has agreed that Welwyn St Mary's will be following this guidance.

This means that unauthorised absence exceeding 15 sessions (each day is two sessions) over 2 consecutive terms risks a fine of up to £120 per parent for each individual child. The Local Education Authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, for failure to secure your child's regular attendance at school. One session is equal to a morning or an afternoon.

So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.

Please note that:

- Even brief term time holidays can affect children in school adversely for some weeks. Both before and after the actual vacation.
- Very few children can afford to miss aspects of the school curriculum.
- Staff are unable to provide activities for your child to complete during unauthorised absences from school.
- It is also highly unlikely that your child will be able to 'catch up' on the work undertaken by classmates whilst your child is on holiday.

We appreciate your understanding and thank you for supporting us in maintaining our high attendance record.
