Year 6 PGL

Year 6 had an exciting time at PGL Liddington this month. They were given some extraordinary opportunities to engage in activities that they may not usually have access to. The activities were: survivor, zip wire, orienteering, raft-building, sensory trail, climbing, problem solving and trapeze.

"Survivor was fun, we had to make shelters out of a tarpaulin, two pieces of rope and some pegs. We also learnt how to make a fire using flint and steel lighting a cotton wool bud. The zip wire was a blast. We were put in a harness and had to jump or step off from about 30 feet in the air. It felt like we were flying. We did orienteering which was map reading. We had to find the number we were given before stamping the card we had. We also did raft building which was fun. You had to build a raft by getting two barrels and tying them together to make a floatable raft so you wouldn't sink. You then did the same on another two barrels and put them together using wooden poles. Some people went into the water at the end of the raft building. The sensory trail was lots of fun. We had these blacked out goggles which we put on and then we had to scramble through an obstacle course. It was amazing fun. Climbing was great. There were two different sides to climb up and one was easier than the other. Some people got close to or got to the top. Problem solving involved a lot of teamwork. We had to flip a tarp from one side to the other without anyone getting off (there were about 12 people on it and we were all squished together on it). Trapeze was so much fun. We had to leap from about 15 foot in the air to grab a metal bar. All in all, we had a great time."

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



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


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Book recommendations


This month's book recommendations:








Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices

A reminder that Hertfordshire County Council issues Penalty Notices which meet the Hertfordshire Code of Conduct <u>regardless of the overall level of the pupil's attendance.</u> Please be advised that the Governing Body has agreed that Welwyn St Mary's will be following this guidance.

This means that unauthorised absence exceeding 15 sessions (each day is two sessions) over 2 consecutive terms risks a fine of up to £120 per parent for each individual child. The Local Education Authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, for failure to secure your child's regular attendance at school. One session is equal to a morning or an afternoon.

So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.

Please note that:

- Even brief term time holidays can affect children in school adversely for some weeks, both before and after the actual vacation.
- Very few children can afford to miss aspects of the school curriculum.
- Staff are unable to provide activities for your child to complete during unauthorised absences from school.
- It is also highly unlikely that your child will be able to 'catch up' on the work undertaken by classmates whilst your child is on holiday.

We appreciate your understanding and thank you for supporting us in maintaining our high attendance record.
