Dear families,

When I think back to the start of January, it feels like a lifetime ago now! It's hard to believe that it has only been an 11-week term with all that we have managed to squeeze into it!

We started early in the Spring term with a 'frog invasion' in Year 5, which meant that the children had to register in the Hall, and then look for clues in their classroom to work out what had happened. This inspired some very creative writing and really inspired the children to write imaginatively, based on first-hand experiences.

Our governors came to join us for our Governors' Day Visit and had the pleasure of joining our classes in their learning, seeing phonics sessions and mathematics lessons in action throughout the school. They had the chance to see children at work, talk to our pupils about their learning and met with School Council. The Governing Body were extremely impressed by all they saw and were very complimentary about the behaviour of the children and their standards of achievement.

Our Years 3 and 4 treated us to some stunning performances of their production 'Hoodwinked', which showcased the talent we have here at Welwyn St Mary's. The children acted, sang and danced to an incredibly high standard and showed us how much can be gained, when offering opportunities to this level.

Many year groups have participated in and benefited from 'do and learn' experiences this term. Our Year 5 enjoyed an immersive and interactive Viking workshop; Year 3, an engaging Greek Day, where they dressed up and took part in a range of activities; and Year 2 experienced 'The Great Fire of London' sessions recently. All of these opportunities received glowing feedback from the children and they really did bring their learning to life.

The list goes on: 45 sporting events so far this year; our in-house Festival of Words and Speakers Cup; the 'Sons' acapella whole school assembly and workshops; World Book Day and author visits, our wooden spoon book characters competition and the whole school English and D&T topic on the book 'Traction Man', which has inspired some much creative writing and D&T work from our children; British Science Week and live-streamed science lessons; Year 5's countryside learning day and Year 6's Hendon Museum visit; School Council's work to raise our awareness of our chosen Tanzania charity and raising money for our sponsored student, Farijika; class assemblies from Reception and Year 2; the Year 5's participation in the dance festival at Campus West, a lovely Easter Service in St Mary's Church led by Reverend David and Mrs Jackson, our school chaplain; and then a whole-school egg decorating competition and the PTFA Easter Egg hunt!

I'm still not sure how we have managed to fit it all in!

As we now approach the end of term, I would like to wish you all a very Happy Easter break. We look forward to welcoming you all back at school on Monday 15th April 2024 (for all that we manage to fit in in the Summer term!).

We have links with local foodbanks so, if you are struggling financially at the moment, please contact the school office in confidence and we can refer you.

Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices

A reminder that Hertfordshire County Council issues Penalty Notices which meet the Hertfordshire Code of Conduct regardless of the overall level of the pupil's attendance. Please be advised that the Governing Body has agreed that Welwyn St Mary's will be following this guidance.

This means that unauthorised absence exceeding 15 sessions (each day is two sessions) over 2 consecutive terms risks a fine of up to £120 per parent for each individual child. The Local Education Authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, for failure to secure your child's regular attendance at school. One session is equal to a morning or an afternoon.

So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.

Please note that:

- Even brief term time holidays can affect children in school adversely for some weeks, both before and after the actual vacation.
- Very few children can afford to miss aspects of the school curriculum.
- Staff are unable to provide activities for your child to complete during unauthorised absences from school.
- It is also highly unlikely that your child will be able to 'catch up' on the work undertaken by classmates whilst your child is on holiday.

We appreciate your understanding and thank you for supporting us in maintaining our high attendance record.
