

Yr 4 Faith Trip

A beautiful write-up about the Y4 Faith trip last month:

First, we got off the coach and had our snack on some steps outside the Gurdwara because we were all hungry after the big coach journey. Then we set off for the Mosque. Everyone noticed the mosque straight away because it had some aqua green domes on top. When we walked in, we took our shoes off, covered our heads and noticed the stone was marble with a shimmer of gold, then we walked into the prayer hall and met a man. We sat on the carpet which had outlines of mats coloured in shades of green with an arch shape in the middle. A man talked about the Mosque and at the end of the slide show there was a photo of the Imam's cat! MEOW! Then we left to go to the church.

When we got to the church we stood outside and looked at it. It was much newer than ours because it has bright red bricks. After that, we went in and sat on rows of chairs then we met a lady who told us about their church and asked us a lot of questions. Then we met a man who took over for a little bit and talked to us about the font which used to be used as a horse trough. After a little bit, the man told us we could touch the font (or the very old horse trough) then we left to go to the Gurdwara to eat lunch in the Langar Hall.

Everyone was excited to eat in the Langar Hall because we were all hungry and it was a new experience. When we walked in, we covered our heads and we took our shoes off and we washed our hands. We walked in and sat down to eat lunch. We ate sitting on the floor in rows on some mats.

When we were all done a man gave an introduction to Sikhism and we asked some questions. Then the man told us to put our bags behind some chairs and we left for the prayer hall. When we were in, we all sat down. He started talking again about the music and something called the five K's then we asked some more questions. Then we got in to two lines down the middle and walked around the Palki Sahib (a canopy for the holy book) we saw the holy book (the Guru Granth Sahib) and then we left, went to pick our bags up, went to the toilet, put our shoes on, then we stood outside to get ready for a picture. When the picture was taken, we then waited for some traffic and we drove back to school.

Raising money for school

Foodbanks help

We have links with local foodbanks so, if you are struggling financially at the moment, please contact the school office in confidence and we can refer you.

Absence Reporting

Please call or email by 9am on each day of your child's absence. Please can we ask that you advise us of the symptoms of any illness rather than just "feeling unwell" so that we can accurately record and monitor this.

Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices

A new National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence, including unauthorised holiday absence, has now been introduced following changes to the law.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines. Parent refers to anyone with parental responsibility and may include carers, step-parents, grandparents or any other adult with parental responsibility.

National Threshold

There is a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice must be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave of absence or unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:

• £160 per parent, per child within 28 days

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court.

- Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines up to £2,500
- Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education.
