We hope that you find all of the information in this leaflet useful. If you have any further questions about the term ahead please feel free to contact us via the school office. Please also read the leaflet about Starting School in your Welcome Pack from last term.

Your child will shortly receive a reading book, flashcards and a reading record book. Please ensure that they bring these to school every day and that you write a comment for each time you have heard them read



or practised their flashcards with them. Flashcards can stay at home as we have sets of these in school.

To support the Letters and Sounds teaching in the classroom, please read with your child for a short period every day and practise their flashcards. Your child will not only benefit from reading to you but also from hearing you read to them.

We encourage each child to learn and follow simple daily routines in order to enable them to become independent and responsible for their own belongings. It would be an enormous help to the staff and your child if you would ensure that each day they have their:

- book bag
- lunch box (if needed)
- snack (if they want one). Snack is available in school if you prefer.
- water (no juice please)

Please ensure that all of your child's clothing is named, including all P.E. kit and shoes/plimsolls.

Our PE days are Tuesday and Thursday. Please ensure that your child comes to school on these days wearing their PE kit.

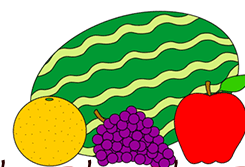
For health and safety reasons, jewellery should not be worn in school. If your child has pierced ears, earrings should be studs only. Earrings must be removed before school on days when we have P.E. lessons.

Long hair must be tied back for PE; we would also appreciate it if children with long hair could tie it back during the general school day with plain and simple bands, clips or ribbons in brown, black or maroon.



Nail varnish should not be worn in school.

Daily fruit is available to the children during the morning, but they are also welcome to bring fresh



fruit or vegetables from home in a named container.

Topics for this term

Our first topic this year is 'All about me'. In this topic we will be thinking about:

Our second topic this term focuses on 'Festivals and Celebrations' and will include:




Harvest ~ We will look at how our natural environment changes throughout the season of Autumn. This includes visiting our nature reserve. We will also think about how we get our food and why harvest time is so important.

 **Fireworks** ~ We will think about how we can keep safe. We will also be learning about pattern and colour.

Important Dates and information


Important dates will be shared via the whole school newsletters and via parent mail.

Using Images Safely and Responsibly

We all enjoy and treasure images of our family and friends. Our new born baby, first steps, family events, holidays and school events are moments we all like to capture in photos or on video.

We then have the added and exciting dimension of adding our images and video to our social network, such as Facebook, YouTube and many other online websites. This means that we can easily share our photos and video with family and friends.

Whilst this is naturally useful, in schools and educational settings we do need to protect and safeguard all children and staff in our school, including those who do not want to have their images stored online.



Online Images and Video

What should we think about before adding online any images or video?
Are there any risks?

Facts

- Once online any image or video can be copied and stay online forever.
- Some children are at risk and **MUST NOT** have their image put online. Not all members of the school community will know who they are.
- Some people do not want their images online for personal or religious reasons.
- Some children and staff may have a complex family background which means that image sharing online can have unforeseen consequences.

We must all 'Think Before We Post' Online

At Welwyn St. Mary's School we are happy for parents and carers to take photos and video of their children at school events for personal use, but request that these images are not distributed or put online. This is to protect all members of the school community
