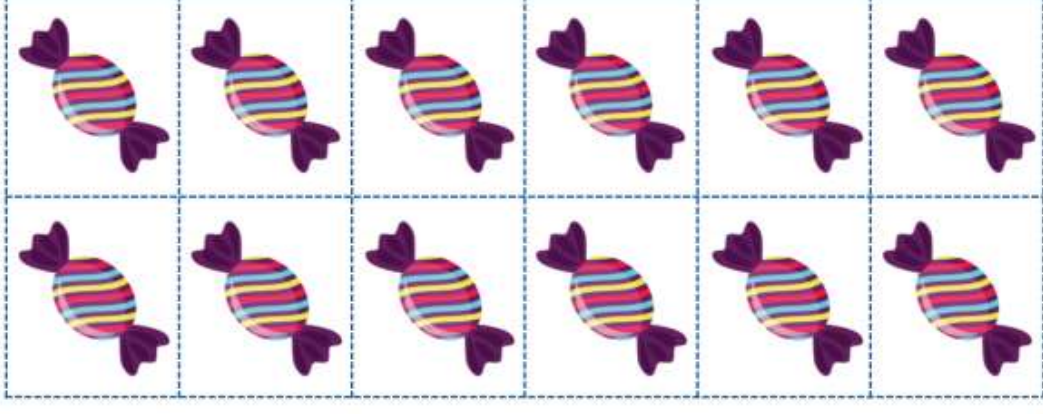

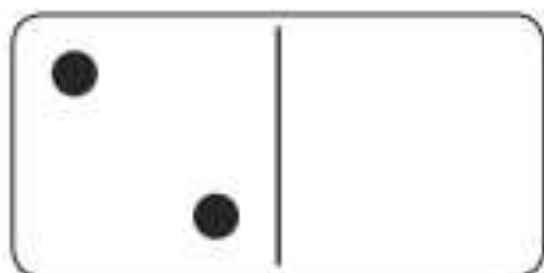
Cut out the birthday treats. Count out the amount you need and share them between your two friends.

Write in the box how many treats they each got.

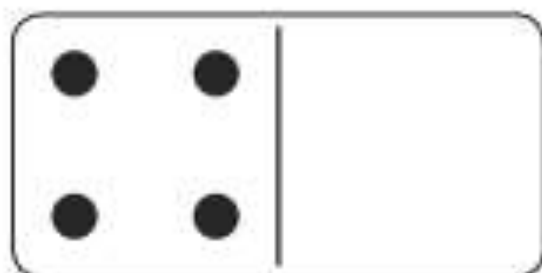


- 8 treats shared between 2 friends is each.

- 10 treats shared between 2 friends is each.

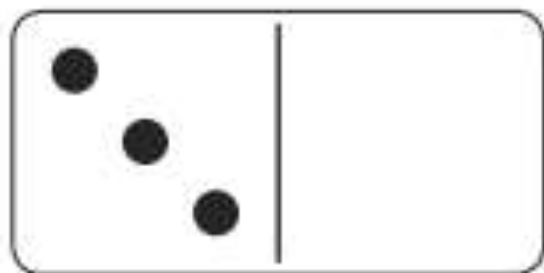

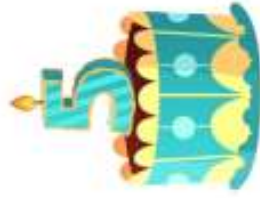
Count how many marbles are in the jar. Draw double the amount in the second jar.

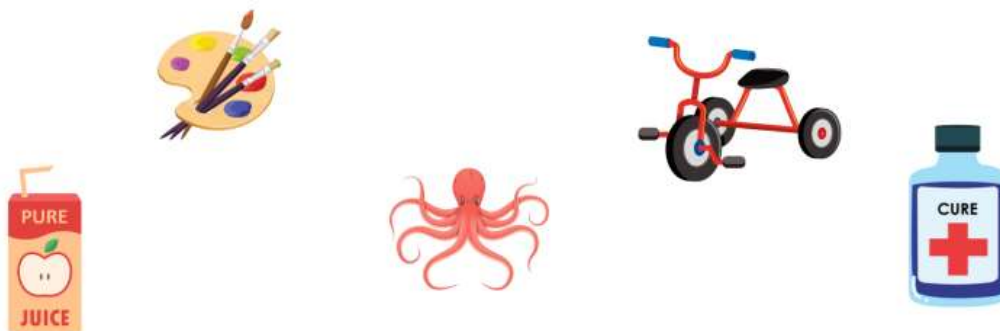
