### School Uniform

Thank you for continuing to support our school uniform policy and sending your children into school looking smart. A few reminders about school uniform:

- No jewellery, make up or nail polish a single pair of small stud earrings are permitted for pierced ears, but these must be removed or taped over for PE. Bracelets, rings and necklaces are not permitted for health and safety reasons and children will be asked to remove them if worn to school.
- Hair accessories these should be in school colours of black, brown or burgundy only. Pink/white hair accessories are acceptable with summer dresses. Hair accessories should be small and plain.
- Shoes trainers should only be worn on PE days. Please make sure that children are wearing plain black school shoes (not boots) on non-PE days
- PE shorts these should ideally be plain black, but very small logos are acceptable. We do not permit football club branded shorts. Please also avoid "hotpant" style shorts - all shorts should be of a suitable length for PE lessons.

#### SMART (St Mary's Amateur Repertory Theatre)

SMART was founded to bring live theatre to children in Welwyn and the surrounding areas. Each year they put on a pantomime/play in the school hall for the local community. After a break during Covid restrictions, SMART is back and would warmly welcome new members. They are looking for performers and backstage helpers across all areas so there are plenty of opportunities to get involved even if you don't want to appear on stage. ### Term Time Absence and Penalty Notices

A reminder that Hertfordshire County Council issues Penalty Notices which meet the Hertfordshire Code of Conduct <u>regardless of the overall level of the pupil's attendance</u>. Please be advised that the Governing Body has agreed that Welwyn St Mary's will be following this guidance.

This means that unauthorised absence exceeding 15 sessions (each day is two sessions) over 2 consecutive terms risks a fine of up to £120 per parent for each individual child. The Local Education Authority may issue you with a Penalty Notice under Section 444 of the Education Act 1996, for failure to secure your child's regular attendance at school. One session is equal to a morning or an afternoon.







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So that parents are aware of the risk of receiving a Fixed Penalty Notice, Welwyn St Mary's will issue warning letters to all parents who request term time holiday, regardless of the length of holiday.

Please note that:

- Even brief term time holidays can affect children in school adversely for some weeks. Both before and after the actual vacation.
- Very few children can afford to miss aspects of the school curriculum.
- Staff are unable to provide activities for your child to complete during unauthorised absences from school.
- It is also highly unlikely that your child will be able to 'catch up' on the work undertaken by classmates whilst your child is on holiday.

We appreciate your understanding and thank you for supporting us in maintaining our high attendance record.
