5 musical things to do at home

1 - Create homemade instruments with household items

Try creating shakers by using dry pasta and rice in empty bottles or covered cups

Line up some milk bottles with varying amounts of water in them

Tap the side gently with a spoon and listen to the difference in pitch. Make up your own tune!

2 - Make your own simple guitar



Using tissue boxes, shoe boxes without the lids or fruit punnets you can create a string-type instrument.

Use the box for the base of the instrument and take four to six rubber bands.

Wrap the rubber bands around the base, the long way, and make sure there is space

between the rubber bands. Experiment with ways of making sounds with the bands.

3 - Think about and use the sounds of daily life

When you are out on your daily walk, listen to the sounds around you.

There won't be so many cars around so you'll be able to hear other sounds really clearly.

4 - Use drawing to think about music



Drawing to sounds and music can be a lovely listening activity.

Listen to different types of music – slow, fast, happy, sad, busy, calm and draw along to the music.
