Daily Routines

We encourage each child to learn and follow simple daily routines in order to make them independent and responsible for their own belongings. It would be an enormous help to the staff and your child if you could support this by doing the following:

- Labelling all belongings including clothes, PE kits and shoes
- Ensuring your child has their PE kit on P.E days
- Ensuring your child has their book bag and lunch box (if they need one) with them in the morning.
- Collecting your child from the key stage 1 playground at the end of each day

Topics for this term

English

In our English lessons we focus on finding and using labels and captions, we will focus on the story of 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and 'Sam Plants a Sunflower' to help us with this. We will also be focussing on narrative using the book 'Puffin Peter'.



How can you help?

Please ensure that your child reads aloud to an adult at home every evening for at least 10 minutes and that you complete their home learning record book by commenting daily and signing it at the end of each week. Please talk to your child about what they have read. Reading *to* your child helps them hear how to become more fluent and expressive – as well as just having fun sharing good books and reading for pleasure. Mathematics

Maths will be taught each day. All areas of study are covered this term and build-up in subsequent terms.

How can you help?

You can encourage your child to count up and back to at least 20, write numbers to 20 the correct way round and do simple addition and subtraction sums with single digit numbers moving on to using bigger numbers as their confidence grows.

<u>RE</u>

This term we will learn about the creation story and harvest celebrations in church and reflect on how wonderful our natural world is. The children will discover how light is an important theme in religions when learning about Diwali and Advent. We will also learn about the Christmas story and the main events of the nativity.

Science

Our science topics for this term are 'The Human Body' and 'Seasonal changes'. This half term we will find out about our five senses, how we grow and change and what we need to stay alive and healthy. We will also begin our learning about the seasons.

Computing

This term, the children will soon receive their individual computer log-ins. They will be introduced to navigating around the computer and will learn how to log in and out independently.

Geography and History



This term we will be focussing on geography. Our geography work will focus on using maps and compasses, and on comparing physical and human-made features with our school as the central focus. The children will have opportunities to read and draw maps, helping them become more familiar with both their home and school locality.

Design and Technology and Art

This term, we will be focusing on the artist Yayoi Kusama. The children will study some of her work, learn about her life, and create artwork inspired by her unique style. They will also develop their skills in colour mixing. As we approach Christmas, the children will enjoy designing and making their own festive cards.

PΕ

In PE we will be focussing on health related fitness. We will measure our heart rate before and after exersising, which will also help us with our Science learning. Trainers that children can fasten themselves are ideal. Don't forget long hair will need to be tied back and earrings removed or covered up.

<u>Music</u>

The children will be encouraged to find their 'singing voice'; they will explore ways of using their voices expressively, developing singing while performing actions. They will develop an understanding of pitch and create chants and sequences. Later in the term we will be learning songs for Christmas.



Homework

In line with the school policy on homework this term we will be sending homework as follows:

- Reading: please ensure that your child continues to read at home every evening for at least 10 minutes and remember to record what they have read at home in the red home learning record book as this helps us to track progress, thank you.
- Word level homework: some children will also bring home flash cards with words to learn or phonic sounds to practise from time to time. Please help children to recognise these words or phonic sounds when reading their book.

Homework will be begin after October half term.

Jewellery

The only permitted jewellery that may be worn is:

- One pair of stud earrings (no other piercings are permitted). Earrings must be taken out or taped for PE.
- A sensible wristwatch (a smartwatch maybe worn if classroom mode is enabled at all times), whilst on the school site and school trips etc.

Jewellery is the responsibility of the pupil and not the school.

Hair

- Long hair needs to be tied back for school, this is for safety and hygiene reasons and to ensure that children's vision is not impeded. Hair should not be cut too short and should not have designs / tramlines shaven into it.
- Hairstyles should be smart and moderate in style. Brightly coloured hair is not permitted.
- Large, excessive hair accessories should not be worn; however, small hair clips or plain headbands or ribbons in brown, black or maroon are acceptable.

At the Headteacher's discretion, there may be exceptions to the above in extreme circumstances e.g. a pupil may be permitted to cover their hair if they have hair loss / illness etc.

Make-Up

Pupils are not allowed to wear make-up or nail varnish. False nails are not permitted.

Labelling

All clothing, shoes, water bottles and school bags should be clearly labelled with your child's name. Any lost clothing is to be taken to the lost property box. All lost property is retained for a term and is disposed of if it is not collected within this time.
