Daily Routines

We encourage each child to learn and follow daily routines, in order to make them independent and responsible for their own belongings. It would be an enormous help to the staff and your child if you could support this by doing the following:

- Arrive to school punctually.
- Label all belongings including clothes, PE kits and shoes.
- Ensure that your child has their PE kit on PE days.
- Ensure that your child has their book bag, water bottle and lunch box (if they need one) with them in the morning.
- Collect your child from the Key Stage 1 playground promptly at the end of each day.

Topics for this Term

We shall be following the National Curriculum to ensure that our school offers a curriculum that is balanced and broadly based.

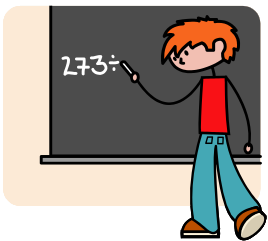
English

We shall develop pupils' spoken language, reading, writing and vocabulary as integral aspects of the teaching of **every** subject. In our English lessons we will focus on the following units: creating non-fiction information texts, exploring and writing fantasy stories and listening to and writing a variety of poems based on a theme.



How can you help?

Please ensure that your child reads aloud to an adult at home **every** day (for at least 10 minutes) and that you complete their 'Home Learning Record' book by commenting daily. Also reading another book to your child helps them to hear how to become more fluent and expressive when they are reading. It is important for us to work together to promote 'reading for pleasure'.



Mathematics We shall use every relevant subject to develop pupils' mathematical fluency and reasoning. Maths will be taught every day, using the Maths Essentials programme. The following strands will be visited each term; number and place value, addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, measurement, and properties of shape.

Maths - how can you help?

You can encourage your child to count up and back to 100, read and write numbers from 1 to 20 in numerals and words, practise simple addition and subtraction sums with single digit numbers - moving on to using 2 digit numbers as their confidence grows.

RE

This term we will be finding out what Christians believe God is like through Bible stories, prayers and artefacts. After half term the children will find out about the features of churches as places of worship. We will try to arrange a visit to Welwyn St. Mary's Church to learn about the building and the people who work and worship there.

Science



Following the National Curriculum, our science topics for this term are: 'Plants' and 'Seasonal Changes'. The children will be taught to identify and name a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. They will also be taught to identify and describe the basic structure of a variety of common flowering plants, including trees.

Computing

This term we will continue to use Purple mash. The children are already familiar with their login and password and can access these resources at home. The children will be taught how to sort items on the computer using the 'Grouping' activities; understand pictograms and how they can be used to represent data; to understand what coding means in computing.

PSHE (Personal, Social and Health Education)

Relationships: We will be focussing on families and friendships; what it is to be a good friend and recognising which forms of physical contact are acceptable and unacceptable.

Changing Me: The children will look at how their bodies have changed or stayed the same since babyhood. We will identify the parts of bodies that make girls and boys different to each other and use the correct terms for these parts.

Geography and History



Our history and geography topics combine this term and focus on 'The Seaside'. The theme of the seaside is set mainly in a geographical context but then we use a historical perspective to help the children understand how seaside places have evolved and changed over time.

Design and Technology and Art

In art, the children will explore watercolour techniques and still life drawing connected to a focus artist. Some of our art will be linked to our 'Seaside Topic' and 'Seasonal Changes' studied in Science and will combine to produce a 3D piece.

Our D and T focus will be looking at fruit and vegetables, their nutritional value and their importance as part of our diet.

PE



Developing partner work and athletics form a large part of this term's PE lessons. Please ensure that your child has their PE kit in school on PE days. Don't forget long hair will need to be tied back and earrings removed, or covered up, for every session.

Music



We will be exploring **beat**: recognising and developing a sense of steady beat; identifying and performing a change in tempo. The children will be learning to play percussion instruments with control and aiming to keep a steady beat.

Homework

In line with the school policy on homework, this term we will be sending homework as follows:

- **Reading:** please ensure that your child continues to read at home every evening for at least 10 minutes and remember to record what they have read at home in their Home Learning Record as this helps us to track progress - thank you.
- **Word level homework:** some children will bring home flash cards with words to learn or phonic sounds to practise.
- **Spellings:** Thank you for your continued support with learning spellings at home. The 'tests' and new lists are given out on Fridays so please help your child to have their green book in school each week.

Our Uniform

Our school endeavours to ensure that our uniform is as gender neutral as possible.

Jewellery

The only permitted jewellery that may be worn is:

- One pair of stud earrings (no other piercings are permitted). Earrings must be taken out or taped for PE.
- A sensible wristwatch (a smartwatch maybe worn if classroom mode is enabled at all times), whilst on the school site and school trips etc.

Jewellery is the responsibility of the pupil and not the school.

Hair

Long hair needs to be tied back for school, this is for safety and hygiene reasons and to ensure that children's vision is not impeded. Hair should not be cut too short and should not have designs / tramlines shaven into it.

Hairstyles should be smart and moderate in style. Brightly coloured hair is not permitted. Large, excessive hair accessories should not be worn; however, small hair clips or plain headbands or ribbons in brown, black or maroon are acceptable.

At the Headteacher's discretion, there may be exceptions to the above in extreme circumstances e.g. a pupil may be permitted to cover their hair if they have hair loss/illness etc.

Make-Up

Pupils are not allowed to wear make-up or nail varnish. False nails are not permitted.

Labelling

All clothing, shoes, water bottles and school bags should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Any lost clothing is to be taken to the lost property box. All lost property is retained for a term and is disposed of if it is not collected within this time.
