Hello and welcome to Year 2!

We hope that you find all of the information in this leaflet useful. If you have any questions about the term ahead, please do let us know so that we can arrange a time to meet with you.

The Autumn Term in Year 2 is always a busy one and we have lots of fun learning to squeeze in! It is important that every child feels happy and safe in their new class so we will spend some time during this term establishing rules, routines and expectations.

There are a few things that you can do at home to help support your child:

- Daily reading please encourage your child to read a little every day and record what they have read in their home learning diaries. If your child has at least 5 entries in a week, they earn a raffle ticket for the Bookflix draw.
- Please ensure that your child brings their reading record and reading book to school every day.
- Support your child to complete home learning tasks and spellings set each week.
- Explore and discuss the meaning of any new vocabulary your child comes across.
- Please ensure that your child's clothing (cardigans, jumpers and coats in particular!) are named.
- Please do let us know if your child struggles with a piece of homework or has any worries about school.

Topics for this term



English

In our English lessons we focus on 'talk for writing' which involves the children spending time exploring and discussing texts to enable them to produce their own pieces of writing. Themes for writing will include writing to entertain and writing to inform.

The current curriculum has a significant focus on accurate grammar, punctuation and using the correct tense when talking or writing. Every English lesson will begin with a 'Stop, Grammar Time' session where children will learn about and use the following:

noun, proper noun, noun phrase, adjective, adverb, verb, statement, question, exclamation, command, compound word, conjunction, suffix, tense (past, present), apostrophe, comma

Your child will have daily whole class guided reading sessions which will help to develop their decoding and comprehension skills. We will explore new vocabulary together and share our views on what we read.

Phonics

Phonics is a crucial part of learning to read and write and feeds into every aspect your child's learning. Your child will participate in daily phonics sessions following the Little Wandle scheme of work. We begin the year by revising phase 5 graphemes and applying them to read and write words.

Mathematics

Maths is taught in daily maths lessons based on National curriculum guidance. This term we focus extensively on place value, shape and

data handling. Regular use of Numicon, Dienes and other manipulative resources help to reinforce the concept of number. We shall use every opportunity to develop pupils' mathematical fluency using a highly practical approach as this is a key objective for the year. Dice, card and counting games at home can support these skills.

Please encourage your child to learn their number pairs up to 20 as they form the foundation of mental calculations and will be used and tested in school frequently. You can also find a useful vocabulary list, suggested websites, some games you might wish to play with your child and a document outlining the progression of written methods in mathematics.

RE

This term we will begin by looking at Creation Stories. We will then learn about Harvest and the value of sharing with others and this fits with the whole school theme of Generosity this term. Our Christmas work will focus on the Three Wise Men and the part they play in the story of Jesus' birth. In particular, we will look at the significance of their gifts and link the symbolism of these gifts to the traditions of today.

Science

In science this term we will be looking at materials. We will think about how materials change when heated or cooled. We will also discuss what are the different properties of materials and what are natural or

manufactured materials.

Computing

In computing, we teach the children about e-safety e.g. being safe when using the Internet. This term, the children will also learn about information technology all around us and digital photography, following the National Centre for Computing Education scheme.

PE

This term, the children will be developing their football skills and exploring balancing in gymnastics. Please ensure your child wears the appropriate PE kit on their PE days and that each item is clearly named. This term, your child's PE days are **Tuesday** and **Friday**. As the weather cools, please ensure your child is warm enough in their kit. Long hair should be tied back and earrings removed or covered.

Geography



In Geography, we look at maps of the world. We travel to the seven continents with Buddy the Bee and learn about the people, cultures and food of different countries.

Art/DT

We look at the work of Kandinsky and a local artist Anneli Boon. We also undertake a puppet unit in D&T, where we will make simple felt puppets using the skill of sewing.

Homework and working in partnership with you.

In line with the school policy on homework this term we will be sending homework as follows:

Reading please ensure that your child continues to read their book at home every evening and that you complete their Reading Record book each day with a comment on your child's progress at home. Please sign it at the end of each week. **Please note:** This year, your child's book will be changed every **Monday** and **Thursday**. We encourage children to read their book several times to develop their fluency and comprehension skills. It is extremely beneficial to read **to** your child as an 'expert reader' whenever possible and include time to talk about their enjoyment and understanding. Please see our website for top tips on how to support your child with their reading.

Spelling homework will be given out on Friday and tested the following Friday in their spelling book. More information about how to support your child with spelling can be found on the inside cover of their book. The children will practise spellings using the 'look, say, cover, write, check' method and other spelling strategies. In class we will also revise and consolidate their phonic knowledge.

Jewellery

The only permitted jewellery that may be worn is:

- One pair of stud earrings (no other piercings are permitted). Earrings must be taken out or taped for PE.
- A sensible wristwatch (a smartwatch maybe worn if classroom mode is enabled at all times), whilst on the school site and school trips etc.

Jewellery is the responsibility of the pupil and not the school.

Hair

Long hair needs to be tied back for school, this is for safety and hygiene reasons and to ensure that children's vision is not impeded. Hair should not be cut too short and should not have designs / tramlines shaven into it.

Hairstyles should be smart and moderate in style. Brightly coloured hair is not permitted. Large, excessive hair accessories should not be worn; however, small hair clips or plain headbands or ribbons in brown, black or maroon are acceptable.

At the Headteacher's discretion, there may be exceptions to the above in extreme circumstances e.g. a pupil may be permitted to cover their hair if they have hair loss / illness etc.

Make-Up

Pupils are not allowed to wear make-up or nail varnish. False nails are not permitted.

Labelling

All clothing, shoes, water bottles and school bags should be clearly labelled with your child's name.

Any lost clothing is to be taken to the lost property box. All lost property is retained for a term and is disposed of if it is not collected within this time.

Please keep checking the monthly newsletters for dates and school events.
